


SURVEY DATA CONSIDERATIONS


- Survey results may not total 312 for every question due to multiple "check all that apply" questions and respondents who elected not to answer every question.



Survey Question:

Top responses:

- More affordable rents and housing (support for rent, build dense housing, more affordable housing, facilitate ADUs, build housing that makes sense for this community, housing for people with disabilities)
- Parking (parking signs, permit parking, parking spaces, curb management, loading zones in commercial areas, enforcement, handicap parking)
- Public safety, Sherriff Substation
- Parks (dog friendly parks, green spaces, parks with walking trails, public bathrooms)
- Illumination of public streets and sidewalks
